



MEDICAL TREATMENT SUPPORT

Year 2022-23, we saw surge in critical medical cases of babies born Pre-Term, with Extreme Low birth weight. Most of the patients had NICU stay for approx. 2 months, with high cost of treatment. TBCF wishes to thank all Donors, made generous contribution as their Individual Social Responsibility for treatment of new born.

One of the core focus of TBCF in this area has always been Cancer treatment support for small children, and could support treatment for 23 cancer afflicted children.

Other type of treatment support included Heart Surgeries, and therapy cost support for autistic child.

Patients from Coimbatore, Pune, Kolkata, Mumbai, Nashik were extended support.







SYMPTOMS OF CANCER

Cancer is a disease in which some of the body's cells grow uncontrollably and spread to other parts of the body. Cancerous tumors spread into, or invade, nearby tissues and can travel to distant places in the body to form new tumors (a process called metastasis). Cancerous tumors may also be called malignant tumors. Many cancers form solid tumors, but cancers of the blood, such as leukemias. An early diagnosis is as important as prevention to get the best outcomes in cancer treatment. Being aware about cancer in is key to early diagnosis. Here are

some of the warning signs of cancer that need further medical attention:-

- o Cough or hoarseness that doesn't go away
- o Blood in sputum, stools or urine
- o Inter menstrual and post-menopausal bleeding
- o Lump in breast
- o Unusual lumps anywhere in the body that increase in size
- o Non-healing wound
- o Bleeding from gums
- o Frequent fever or infections
- o Excessive weight loss and loss of appetite
- o Intense and recurrent pain

The Baby Care Foundation understands the early treatment of this dreaded disease. TBCF has tied up with various hospitals to support treatment expenses support for marginalized children suffering afflicted with cancer.

Medical Treatment Support- HEART

Considering a birth prevalence of congenital heart disease as 9/1000, the estimated number of children born with congenital heart disease in India is more than 200,000 per year. Of these, about one-fifth are likely to have serious defect, requiring an intervention in the first year of life. Currently advanced cardiac care is available to only a minority of such children. A number of cardiac centres have been developed over the last 10 years.

However, most are in the private sector, and are not geographically well-distributed. Challenges to paediatric cardiac care include financial constraints, health-seeking behaviour of community, and lack of awareness.

Most of the children born with congenital heart disease are expected to lead normal, productive lives if treated in time. However, the privilege of early diagnosis and timely intervention is restricted to children born in developed countries. India has one of the highest birth rates in the world and, considering that the prevalence of congenital heart disease does not vary in different regions, a large number of babies with congenital heart disease are born in India every year.

It is estimated that approximately 80,000 new-borns with heart disease need early intervention to survive their first birthday. Less than 10% of these actually undergo intervention. Providing optimal care for all these children is a daunting task, and requires funds and proper planning at various levels of the healthcare system.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT

The main objective of this tailoring training program is to enhance the quality of life of women and teenage girls through enhancement of their skills and knowledge.

The tailoring programme provides vocational training to women in stitching, embroidery and knitting. The centres run on mobile basis and post the completion at one location, needs assessment is conducted and a new village is identified for the implementation. Apart from sewing and tailoring, embroidery and basic knitting were also included in the programme so that the beneficiaries can utilize these skills in increasing their earning capacity. During the financial year, four batches of the training were done in two villages and 120 girls completed their three-month course.



TBCF imparted this training in association with implementing partner –Snehabhijan, in Dist: Sundergarh, Odisha.

There is a need to bring awareness and provide financial responsibilities making women become conversant with the accounts both profit and loss useful to maintain their family, with the training activity's women role will be enhanced in family and community.

Tailoring Training will create a strong social and economic capital of organized communities. This will not only have implications for stronger service delivery but will also lead to comprehensive community organizations, which are essential for the development of a just and equitable society. It is expected that 120 females would be uplifted socially. Direct employment or self-employment of female will result due to these interventions.

TBCF is trying to provide a solution to this. By making Tailoring Training to women, we are promoting that there be no gender discrimination but empowerment of women for a better life.

Odisha successfully completes a 3-month tailoring skills program and receives their certification.

EDUCATION PROGRAMME





Continued our support for financially weak children in providing school fees.

We reached out to Schools in rural parts of Palghar, Maharashtra and set up Digital Classrooms. This helped children to enhance their knowledge and information through Audio Visual mode.

Teachers also empowered themselves with technology and fast changing Education scenario.

Laptops were distributed to bright students; Computer labs were set up in schools. 29 Children belonging to financial weaker section were provided training in MSCIT, Advanced Excel and Tally.





RENEWAL ENERGY

Close to half of the students in India still read in the dark, and are untouched. This also means that children up to six years of age visiting Ashram Shalas (School cum Hostel) find it difficult to concentrate in dark and hot rooms, subsequently missing and dropping out; adversely affecting early childhood development. Teachers are understandably reluctant to work in deprived areas, which lack basic facilities such as electricity, good housing, and health care." Hence electricity will also lead to increased staff retention and better teacher training. In aggregate, the benefits from electricity-based lighting, ICT, and improved teaching lead to better outcomes in school performance—less truancy and absenteeism, higher enrolment rates, better WASH facilities which means lesser water-borne diseases, higher graduation and completion rates, and the achievement of higher test scores.




RENEWAL ENERGY

The impact of electrification goes beyond mere education and nutrition and considers the environment and cost savings to the exchequer.

TBCF identifies such School cum Hostel, in remote Rural areas, where electricity plays truant. Classrooms and hostel rooms are installed with solar powered fans and lights, the campus and peripheral areas for such institutions, solar powered solar street lights are installed.

TBCF installed 35 Solar Street lights, Home lighting system inside hostels in Ashram Shala, Talvade, Taluka: Vikramgarh, Dist: alghar, Maharashtra, 6 nos Solar Powered ceiling fans and 24 home lighting system in Zilla Parishad School, Village- Dahyale, Dhanau, Palghar, 15 Solar Street lights in Village – Patilpada & Sutarpada of Dhanau, Palghar.





Menstrual Hygiene Management

Lack of awareness on menstrual hygiene results into a continuous challenge in the life of adolescent girls even in this civilized society. This is because of the deep-rooted taboo and the level of ignorance in the minds of people about menstruation. Due social misconception, lack of awareness and lack of proper understanding about the human biological development, many girls suffer physically and psychologically. Lack of menstrual health awareness also results in grave health related issues and is also termed as one of the main reasons for cervical cancer at later stages.

This programme for promotion of Menstrual Hygiene combines health education for adolescent girls, providing a regular supply of sanitary napkins and enabling other sanitation measures such as access to water and toilets in schools and in the community through convergence with other programmes.









Clean Water, Sanitation & Hygiene

WASH refers to safe drinking-water, sanitation and hygiene which are crucial to human health and well-being. Safe WASH is not only a prerequisite to health, but contributes to livelihoods, school attendance and dignity and helps to create resilient communities living in healthy environments.

Poor access to safe drinking water, toilets, and poor WASH practices due to poverty, lack of awareness and inaccessibility lead to several WASH related challenges.

Some of the consequences include:

- Poor sanitation is linked to transmission of diseases such as cholera, diarrhoea, dysentery, Hepatitis A, typhoid, and polio and exacerbates stunting
- Poor sanitation impacts human well-being, social and economic development due to anxiety, risk of sexual assault, and lost educational opportunities
- Inadequate sanitation is estimated to cause 4,32,000 diarrhoeal deaths annually and is a major factor in several neglected tropical diseases, including intestinal worms, schistosomiasis, and trachoma. Poor sanitation also contributes to malnutrition.

Clean Water, Sanitation & Hygiene

TBCF ensured clean toilets for boys in Ashram Shala, Talvade, Palghar, Maharashtra to benefit 600 boys. A new deep Well was dug within school premises to ensure uninterrupted source of water. Along with these 2 storage tanks were installed with capacity of 10,000 lits each, RO water machine with 25LPH was also installed. This directly benefitted 1260 children and 35 staff of the Ashram Shala.









CALAMITY RELIEF

Again, Chennai was largely affected by torrential rains, and most of the low-lying parts of city got inundated. TBCF with support from Corporate, immediately swung into action, and mobilized dry ration and portable drinking water for 500 worst affected evacuated families. Distribution was co-ordinated by Chennai Municipal authorities.





Baby Feeding Centre

All women and their children should be free to breastfeed in public, anytime, anywhere. Breastfeeding has amazing health benefits for both mother and child. For toddlers, having breast milk for the initial six months is mandatory because of the nutrition quotient present in the milk. This helps the toddler to build a healthy immune system and live a healthier life. Also, the bond between a mother and the child grows stronger and empowers both to lead a healthy life. Feeding when they are hungry and being able to stop when they are full helps them to retain this ability. However, not every mother who wants to breastfeed has the support she needs to do so. Breastfeeding in public is looked down upon in public spaces and places of transit.

TBCF has installed 09 Baby feeding units in Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) hospitals, where in the mothers can feed their infants in privacy







