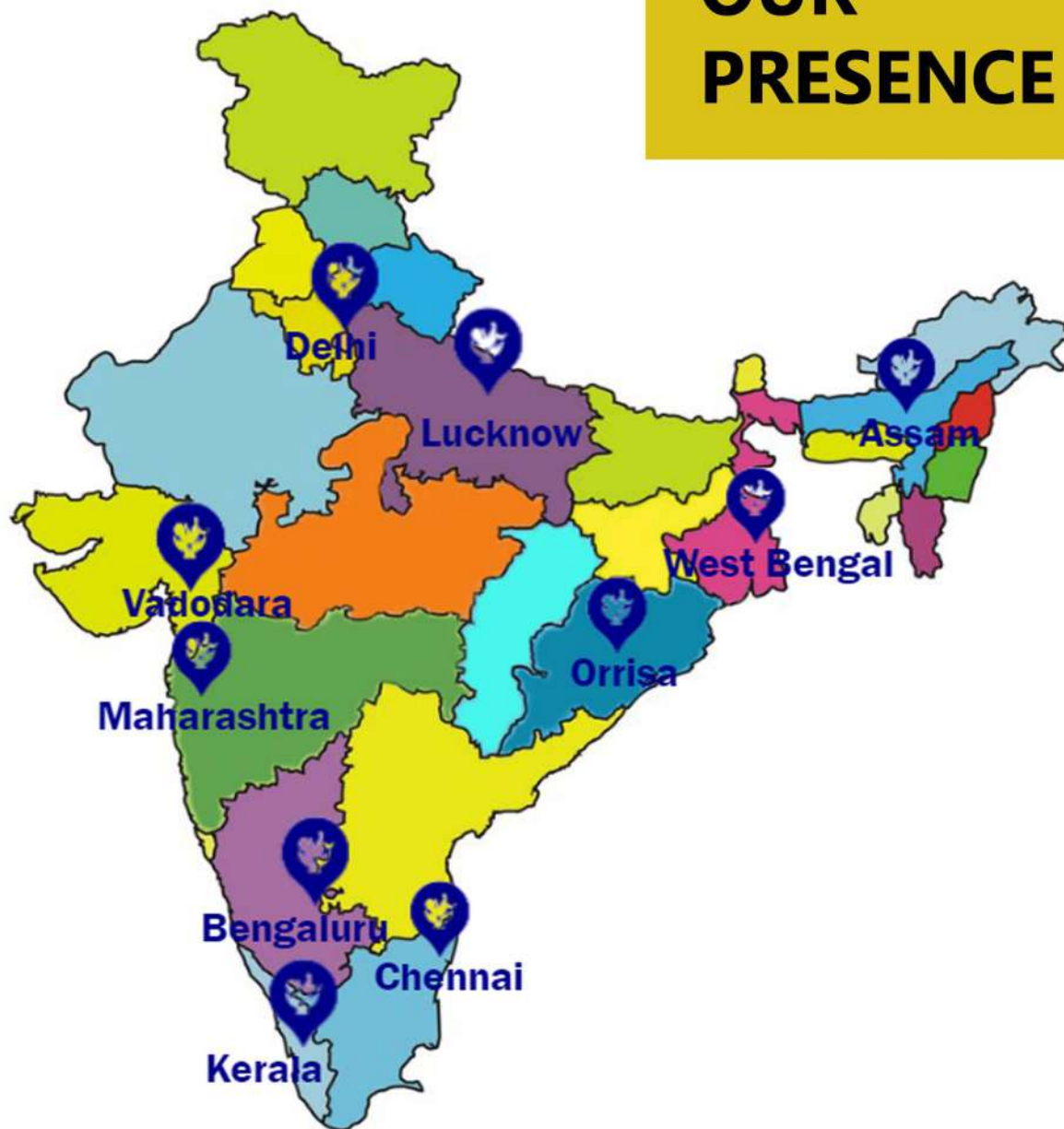

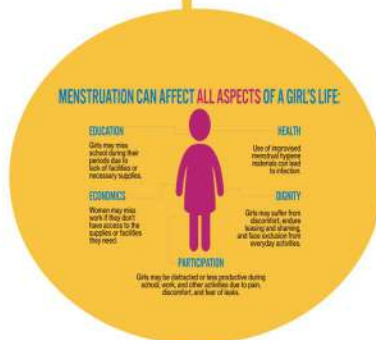

SYMPTOMS OF CANCER

Cancer is a disease in which some of the body's cells grow uncontrollably and spread to other parts of the body. Cancerous tumors spread into, or invade, nearby tissues and can travel to distant places in the body to form new tumors (a process called metastasis). Cancerous tumors may also be called malignant tumors. Many cancers form solid tumors, but cancers of the blood, such as leukemias.

An early diagnosis is as important as prevention to get the best outcomes in cancer treatment. Being aware about cancer in is key to early diagnosis. Here are some of the warning signs of cancer that need further medical attention:-

- o Cough or hoarseness that doesn't go away
- o Blood in sputum, stools or urine
- o Inter menstrual and post-menopausal bleeding
- o Lump in breast
- o Unusual lumps anywhere in the body that increase in size
- o Non-healing wound
- o Bleeding from gums
- o Frequent fever or infections
- o Excessive weight loss and loss of appetite
- o Intense and recurrent pain

Medical Treatment Support- HEART

Considering a birth prevalence of congenital heart disease as 9/1000, the estimated number of children born with congenital heart disease in India is more than 200,000 per year. Of these, about one-fifth are likely to have serious defect, requiring an intervention in the first year of life. Currently advanced cardiac care is available to only a minority of such children. A number of cardiac centres have been developed over the last 10 years. However, most are in the private sector, and are not geographically well-distributed. Challenges to paediatric cardiac care include financial constraints, health-seeking behaviour of community, and lack of awareness.

Most of the children born with congenital heart disease are expected to lead normal, productive lives if treated in time. However, the privilege of early diagnosis and timely intervention is restricted to children born in developed countries. India has one of the highest birth rates in the world and, considering that the prevalence of congenital heart disease does not vary in different regions, a large number of babies with congenital heart disease are born in India every year.

It is estimated that approximately 80,000 new-borns with heart disease need early intervention to survive their first birthday. Less than 10% of these actually undergo intervention. Providing optimal care for all these children is a daunting task, and requires funds and proper planning at various levels of the healthcare system.

TBCF has tied up with following hospitals for providing cost support for heart surgery –

Menstrual Hygiene Management

Menstrual Hygiene Management is TBCF's prime focus area. Year 2021-22, this organisation executed 12 projects in this thematic area. Awareness and extensive advocacy programs were done amongst Adolescent girls, young women in rural areas and Urban slums. This included health camps too. The Organisation focused in Districts of Palghar, Thane, Mumbai & Howrah(W.B).





Sanitation & Clean Drinking Water

This Organisation focused on maintenance of toilets already constructed in previous years. Advocacy programs were conducted at schools with increasing awareness amongst young students for Hygiene management.

Sanitation & Clean Drinking Water

There is a direct correlation between the access to clean gender specific toilets in schools and educational outcomes. Even as recently as two years ago, nearly 40 percent of the 1.5 million schools in India lacked toilets; the percentage was even higher when looking at usable bathrooms specifically for girls.

The issue becomes even more complex in rural scenarios; wherein many students are first generation learners who have yet to derive or understand the long-term benefits of education. In a predominantly archaic patriarchal system, there is a still a reluctance to send girls to school, a lack of separate toilets aggravates the problem. This especially deters adolescent girls from continuing their education. The result of this is intergenerational illiteracy, which prevents a major percentage of India's young population from being a productive work force.



Statistics obtained from both government and non-governmental agencies clearly proves that constructing usable and clean latrines in schools decreased dropout rates; reducing the fraction of students who dropped out by 5.3% in the middle schools and by 12.2% in primary schools.

CALAMITY RELIEF

Natural and human-caused disasters affect thousands of people each year. Major adverse events such as these have the potential to cause catastrophic loss of life and physical destruction. They are often unexpected and can leave whole communities in shock.

People who live through a disaster can experience emotional distress. Feelings of anxiety, constant worrying, trouble sleeping, and other depression-like symptoms are common responses to disasters before, during, and after the event. Many people are able to "bounce back" from disasters with help from family and the community, but others may need additional support to cope and move forward on the path of recovery. Anyone can be at risk, including survivors living in the impacted areas and first responders and recovery workers.

India has witnessed many natural disasters be it in form of Odisha Super Cyclone (1999) or Gujarat Earthquake (2001) or even the Indian Ocean Tsunami (2004). In the article below, we have compiled the list of 7 most horrible natural calamities in the history of India.

Responsive feeding takes advantage of a young baby's natural ability to regulate their intake of calories – something that can disappear when a baby gets older. Feeding when they are hungry and being able to stop when they are full helps them to retain this ability. However, not every mother who wants to breastfeed has the support she needs to do so. Breastfeeding in public is looked down upon in public spaces and places of transit.

Breast feeding is the most natural and important aspect of mother-child bonding and child nutrition. Lactating mothers have to feed their infants at regular intervals; until the child completes 6 months.





BABY FEEDING CENTRE

In the absence of baby feeding rooms, it can be extremely difficult and embarrassing for mothers carrying infants to breastfeed their babies in public. Hence The Baby Care Foundation facilitated the construction of baby feeding room in 4 identified hospitals as mentioned below. This facility was set up within the premises of the Hospitals.

1. Malvani Municipal Dispensary & Malvani 2 Health Post.
2. General Hospital, Malvani, Malad- West
3. Maternity Hospital, Malvani, Malad West
4. Choksy Hospital, Malad-West.
